They also managed to fill up their marble jar and chose to have a pyjama party with popcorn and a movie as their reward!






### **Junior News**





#### **Book Fair**

Throughout next week, we will be holding a **Book Fair** in the **Library Corridor**. You are all very welcome to come and browse from 3.30 p.m. to 5.00 p.m. each afternoon. We can take cash or cheques. We receive a fantastic commission from Travelling Books, of books worth 60% of the Book Fair takings, so we very much appreciate your support.



From **Monday 30th September**, your child may come home with a **'Book Wish Form'**, which will indicate the title of a book he or she chose at the fair whilst browsing with the class. Please do not feel obliged to buy this book; do come and browse through the books after school.

If you cannot make it to the Book Fair, but you would like to buy the book your child has picked out, please send in a cheque made payable to **Cranmore School** in an envelope, together with the **'Book Wish Form'**. Address the envelope to **Mrs Watkinson** and return it via their teachers or at the Main Reception. Their book will be sent home via their class teacher.
